

FACILITY RULES & REGULATIONS

for Warsaw-Radom Airport

To ensure safety during the International AirSHOW Radom 2025, acting pursuant to Article 6 (3) of the Mass Event Safety Act of 20 March 2009 (Journal of Laws of 2023, Item 616), hereinafter referred to as the Mass Event Safety Act, these Rules & Regulations are hereby adopted.

§ 1.

1. The Organiser of the International AIRSHOW Radom 2025 is the Military Property Agency with its registered office in Warsaw, ul. Nowowiejska 26, 00-911 Warszawa, hereinafter referred to as the Organiser.
2. The Warsaw-Radom Airport, ul. Sadków 9, 26-603 Radom, hereinafter referred to as the “Air Show Site” or the “Facility”, will be open to the audience within designated zones during the International AirSHOW Radom 2025 (hereinafter referred to as the “Air Show”), i.e.,
 - 1) on 30 August 2025 (Saturday), between 10:00 a.m. and 10:30 p.m.,
 - 2) on 31 August 2025 (Sunday), between 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.
3. Air Show participants with SPOTTER Premium tickets will be additionally entitled to enter the Facility area as part of a designated zone:
 - 1) on 29 August 2025 (Friday), within opening hours to be set out by the Organiser;
 - 2) on 1 September 2025 (Monday), within opening hours to be set out by the Organiser.

§ 2.

The detailed rules of conduct and the availability of the Facility for the audience during the mass event shall be set out in the Rules & Regulations of International AirSHOW Radom 2025.

§ 3.

The Site is subject to security measures and surveillance 24/7.

§ 4.

1. The Facility may be accessed for a fee and on the basis of a valid ticket or the Organiser's authorisation to enter the event on other terms, i.e. identification badge, accreditation, invitation or another type of pass. The Organiser reserves the right to close entrances to the Facility if the allowed number of participants on the Air Show Site is exceeded.
2. Participants may enter and leave the Air Show Site solely through designated entrances/exits, as marked on a site map attached hereto as Appendix 1.
3. The purchase of a ticket or authorisation to enter the Facility area shall be equivalent to the acceptance of these Rules & Regulations.
4. The Organiser reserves itself the right to refuse any person to enter the Facility and is not obligated to justify its decision. The Organiser's decision is final and not subject to a complaint procedure. In this case the Participant has the right to apply for a refund of the ticket price.

§ 5.

1. All persons on site of the Facility (Participants) are obliged to adhere to organisational instructions given by security and information services under these Rules & Regulations, and in the event of intervention by the officers of the Police, State Fire Service, Border Guard, Military Police or the representatives of other authorised services and bodies - to adhere to the instructions of the said services.
2. All persons entering and staying on site of the Facility may be subjected to control, consisting in, i.a., the inspection of identity documents to determine identity and verify the details included in the tickets against such documents, examining the contents of luggage and clothing, and luggage scanning, to prevent forbidden items from being carried in. Any person who refuses to be subjected to the above activities or any person holding a weapon or other items, materials, products, beverages, agents or substances referred to in Article 8 (2) of the Mass Event Safety Act, may be refused admission or removed from the site of the Facility.

§ 6.

A minor child aged under 13 may enter and stay on site of the Facility solely under the care of an adult person, and under such adult's sole responsibility.

§ 7.

1. It is forbidden to carry in and hold the following items on site of the Facility:
 - 1) liquid or food containers, including food products, made of hard materials, including, in particular, glass or another fragile material, except where such containers have been allowed by the Organiser in writing;
 - 2) any liquids, including in particular alcoholic beverages, except:
 - a) water in originally capped plastic bottles with a capacity of up to 0.5 litre,
 - b) beverages intended for children under 3, including milk, intended for the personal use of the children being Air Show Participants, subject to the production of a document confirming the child's age, and provided that such beverages are carried in plastic containers or bags with a capacity of up to 0.5 litre;
 - 3) helmets;
 - 4) umbrellas with a sharp end tip;
 - 5) plastic bottles, except bottles meeting the criteria set forth in point 2;
 - 6) balloons, kites, toys, flying models or other objects which can move freely in the air in a controlled or uncontrolled manner;
 - 7) laser pointers;
 - 8) unmanned aerial vehicles, including drones;
 - 9) gas spray containers, corrosive substances or paint;
 - 10) objects with dimensions of over 250 cm (length + width + height), provided that in no event any of the dimensions may exceed 150 cm. The prohibition shall not apply to baby buggies, wheelchairs or other types of devices which are necessary due to the health condition or disability of a given Air Show Participant, or to any other situations where the Organiser has issued a written consent;

- 11) trumpets or mechanically- or electric-powered instruments which generate noise (vuvuzelas, megaphones, sirens, etc.), except those allowed under a written consent issued by the Organiser;
- 12) materials containing racist, offensive, political, xenophobic, discriminating, or vulgar contents;
- 13) weapons, ammunition or other dangerous objects which may be used as weapons, including weapons to inflict incised wounds, punctures or thrust, and explosives, pyrotechnic products, fireworks, flares and other substances of similar action, as well as any types of fire hazardous materials;
- 14) skateboards, longboards, single-track vehicles, roller blades, roller skates and any other equipment of a similar type;
- 15) bags and rucksacks with a capacity greater than 30 litres, and to leave bags and rucksacks unattended;
- 16) other objects which, for objective reasons, may pose danger to the life and health of Air Show Participants and personnel, or affect the safety and the uninterrupted course of the Air Show.

2. It is also forbidden to:

- 1) bring in pets on site of the Facility, except service dogs accompanying persons with disabilities, and vehicles, including bicycles, electric scooters, and other personal mobility devices;
- 2) stay on site of the Facility under the evident influence of alcohol, narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances, or other agents of similar action;
- 3) stay in locations which are not intended for the audience, including in closed military zones and airport operational zones. The ban also includes crossing the barriers outside the zone intended for the audience; and
- 4) throw objects which may pose threat to the life and health of persons staying on site of the Facility;
- 5) throw and leave behind rubbish which may cause damage to aircraft and disrupt the Air Show;
- 6) litter up the site of the Facility;
- 7) start a fire on site of the Facility;
- 8) use devices constituting the equipment of the Facility in a way which is not consistent with its intended use;
- 9) go inside/climb on the exhibited military equipment without the consent of the crew/service staff;
- 10) unjustifiably occupy places in passageways and in the area of evacuation routes and fire department access routes;
- 11) use any parts of clothing or any items to cover your face to hinder identification or make it impossible;
- 12) park vehicles which are not part of a food-establishment or exhibition stand in areas intended for the audience;
- 13) obstruct passageways with vehicles, with particular attention to the marked fire department access routes.

§ 8.

1. Commercial, catering, service and artistic activities, including broadcasts, radio and TV recordings, filming and making photos within the Facility area is subject to rules set by the Organiser.
2. Any limitations in respect of filming and taking photographs shall not apply to the activities performed by the Organiser as part of official functions or to materials intended for strictly private use.

§ 9.

The Air Show Organiser shall not be held liable for any objects lost, stolen, or left behind by the participants on site of the Facility.

§ 10.

Persons who violate the provisions of these Rules & Regulations may be removed from the Facility.

§ 11.

The Organiser may claim compensation for the damage caused on site of the Facility, including compensation for the infringement of its image.

§ 12.

The Facility Rules & Regulations are available on <https://airshowradom.pl/> and are displayed at the entrances to the Facility.

By accepting these Rules & Regulations, any person staying on site of the Facility shall grant to the Organiser a gratuitous consent to the recording and use of their image, including the gratuitous use, recording, processing, copying, and dissemination of their image recorded in the form of photographs or video footage, and shall grant to the Organiser a non-exclusive and royalty-free licence, unlimited as to territory and duration, to use their image recorded in relation to their stay at the Air Show for informational, promotional, and advertising purposes related to the Facility, the Air Show and the Organiser's operations, including the following fields of use:

- 1) recording and reproducing their image with the use any known methods, and disseminating thereof in any form;
- 2) saving on computer memory and in multimedia networks;
- 3) reproducing the recorded image;
- 4) exhibiting, screening, playing, broadcasting and rebroadcasting to the public, and making the image available to the public so that anyone can have access to it in a place and time of their choice, in particular on social media sites administered by the Organiser;
- 5) placing and publishing in press, on websites, posters, billboards, and social media;
- 6) broadcasting on television and radio.

§ 13.

These Rules & Regulation shall be effective on the date they are signed.

§ 14.

The following appendices are an integral part of these Rules & Regulations:

- 1) the Site Map,
- 2) Information on Personal Data Processing.
